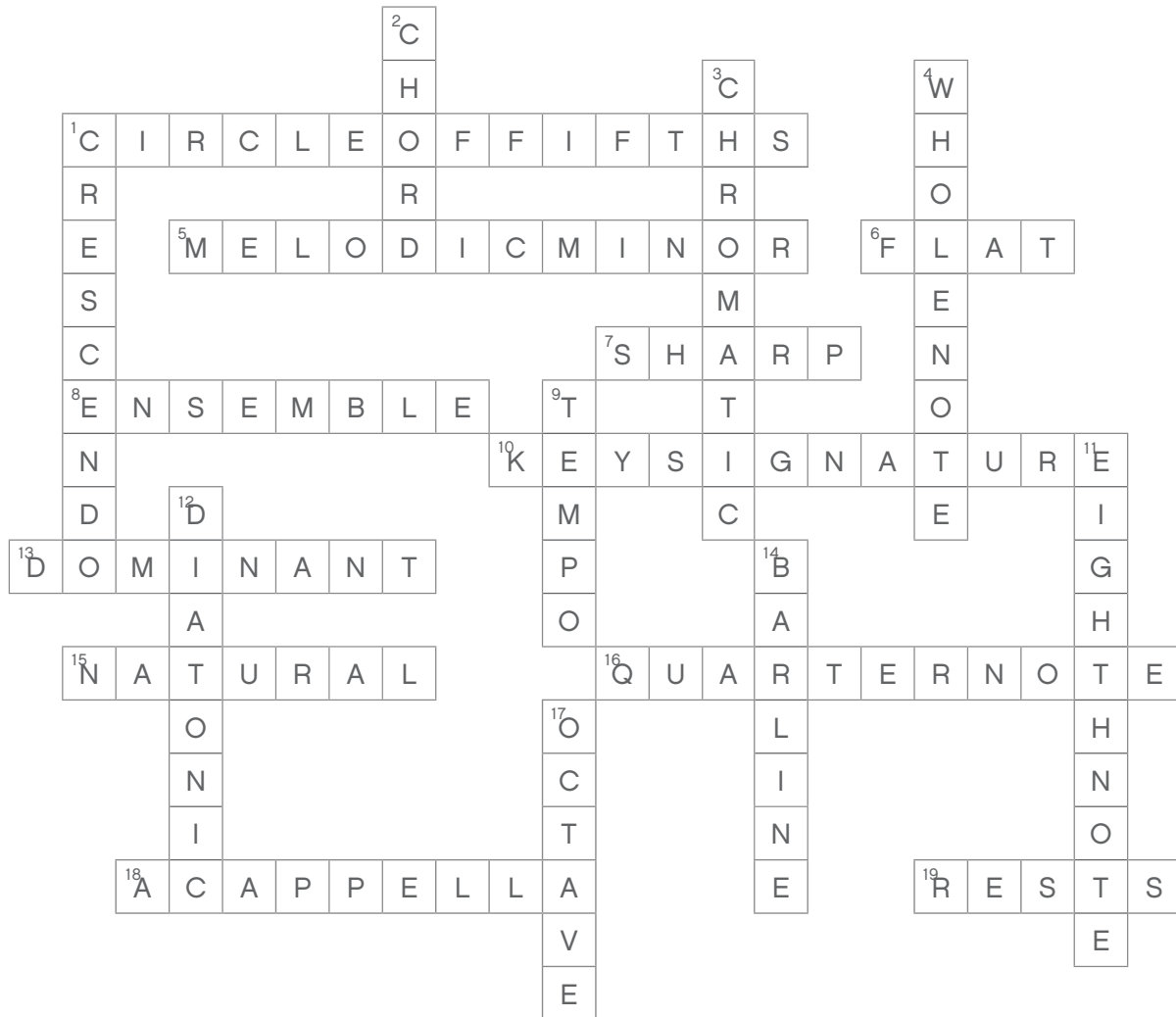


# Back to Music

## Crossword Puzzle



### ACROSS

- The clockwise arrangement of successive keys arranged in order of ascending fifths.
- A natural minor scale with the sixth and seventh degrees raised while ascending, and the sixth and seventh degrees lowered while descending.
- The symbol  $\flat$  that indicates a note to be lowered one half step.
- The symbol  $\sharp$  that indicates to raise a pitch by one half step.
- Any group of musicians performing together.
- The group of sharps or flats that appears at the beginning of a staff which indicates the key of a piece of music.
- The fifth degree of a major or minor scale.
- The symbol  $\natural$  that indicates a note is neither sharp nor flat.
- A note that is half the length of a half note.
- Without accompaniment.
- Symbols that are used to indicate silence.

### DOWN

- Gradually becoming louder.
- Three or more tones sounded simultaneously. *(Hint: two tones are usually referred to as an interval or dyad.)*
- A scale composed of all 12 half steps of an octave.
- A note that is equal in length to two half notes.
- The speed of a section of a composition, or of a complete composition.
- A note that is half the length of a quarter note.
- The notes found within a major or minor scale.
- A vertical line that divides measures, or bars.
- The interval of eight diatonic steps or from one note to its nearest note of the same name, 12 half steps away.
